
Rest assured that ALL the money donated to the Appeal will go to Scouting projects.

## R W Bro Guy Yves Jerman PProvGM

RW.Bro Guy Yves Jerman, LLB was a Solicitor and Essex Coroner living in Thorpe Bay when he was Initiated into Sweyn Lodge



No. 4764 at Southend on 19th January 1959, at the age of 33. He served in the usual progressive offices and was installed as Master on 16th October 1966.

In the Province of Essex his first Craft appointment was to Deputy Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies in 1973, followed by promotions to Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies in 1977 and Assistant Provincial Grand Master in 1980. He was appointed as Deputy Provincial Grand Master by RWBro Frederick W R Leistikow in 1983 and then became only the 4th DepPGM in the history of the Province to be appointed as a Provincial Grand Master, in 1986. He was also appointed as the Most Excellent Grand Superintendent in and over Essex that same year and faithfully served the Province in those two capacities until 1995.

In the United Grand Lodge of England he was appointed as an Assistant Grand Registrar in 1977, promoted to Past Senior Grand Deacon in 1982 and again to Past Grand Sword Bearer in 1984. His path in Royal Arch Masonry began with his Exaltation into Nore Chapter No. 3610 in 1960. He was First Principal in 1970.

At Loughton he joined Ambresbury Chapter No. 5099 in 1983.In late 1970 he was a key member in the setting up of the Southend Masonic Welfare Trust. Considerable funds were raised through various major activities at the Cliffs Pavilion.

In 1992 the Guy Jerman Lodge No. 9506 was consecrated as a Lodge exclusively for Lodge Secretaries and Treasurers. RWBro Jerman became Worshipful Master of that Lodge in 2001/2002, as a tribute to his influence and achievements.

Sadly, he passed to the Grand Lodge Above on 21st August 2016. He will be sadly missed by his Brother Freemasons and, in particular, his wife Betty and their family and friends. Our thoughts and prayers are with them at this sad time.
